

## KIK's NSF ANSI 60 Ratings Statement.

This issue periodically comes up here and there as there are multiple classifications for use under the NSF Umbrella.

KIK <u>DOES NOT</u> certify <u>ANY</u> bottled Bleach as NSF ANSI 60 rated. This is a classification for use in drinking water disinfection / treatment.

## **LOGIC:**

KIK recognizes that we live in a litigant society today and this would open up TOO much exposure for lawsuits if misused. The producer nor the seller have any control over the actual usage and dosing of the product at the end user site in the drinking water application. If there was a mishap — every entity that touched that bottle involved in the incident would get sued in a lawsuit and expensive litigation would result. We feel that this type of risk exposure for a small \$\$ case sale is way too much for KIK and our customers as well.

For that reason, KIK does NOT certify any NSF ANSI 60 ratings on any of our bottled bleaches.

KIK does have NSF Whitebook listings on the PureBright Germicidal ULTRA Bleach for various uses in Food preparation area cleaning / applications. Further information on these ratings are available from KIK.
